One of our treasures in the Shores is our open space. On behalf of our community, the Redwood Shores Community Association was recognized for the




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

REDWOOD CITY APPOINTS NEW DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RESOURCES

Concluding a thorough, exhaustive search and evaluation process, Redwood City has hired a new Director of Human Resources. Mr. Robert Bell, formerly the Human Resources Director for the City of Burlingame, started work for Redwood City on September 19th. Mr. Bell's depth of experience, professional credentials, and progressive attitude were key in the hiring decision. "Bob brings a fresh perspective to our HR program, and take this already-innovative department to new levels of creativity and service," said City Manage Ed Everett. Redwood City's Human Resources Department consists of ten staff people who provide HR services to nearly 600 employees. The department is responsible for recruitments, employee development, benefits and legal administration, worker's compensation, performance management, and personnel systems management. The department also has a selection of services which it offers on a fee basis to other cities, agencies, and private firms.

COMMUNITY SAFETY ALERT

During the past few months several arson fires have been started in Redwood City. All of these fires occurred at night, were set in apartment buildings, and were most frequently started in carports, laundry rooms, storage areas, garbage containers, and other common areas. Fortunately, the quick action of the Fire Department has limited these fires from spreading and injuring residents.

It's important that residents work together with the City to help protect the safety of the community, property, and lives. Here's what you can do:

* Be alert to suspicious persons in carport areas and laundry room areas of apartment complexes

* Immediately report any suspicious persons or activity to the Redwood City Police at 780-7100

* In the event of a fire or other emergency, immediately call 911 * Please share this information with your neighbors, associations, etc.

A \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of those responsible for these crimes was offered by the Redwood City Police Department and the Federal Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco & Firearms. If you have information regarding any of these fires, please contact Detective Jackie Gouldson at 780-7620.

Safety precautions for you and your neighbors:

* Do not pile easily-combustible material such as furniture, clothing, junk, weeds, etc., in or around carports, laundry rooms, garbage areas, water heaters, underneath stairways, or in common areas.

* Any fuels, propane cylinders, gas cans, garden machinery, charcoal, barbecue lighters, matches, and other ignition devices should be stored in a safe and secure manner.

* All parked vehicles, including those in carports, should be locked.

* Make sure all fire extinguishers in your home are easily accessible, in good working condition, and that you know how to use them.

* Make sure that smoke detectors are installed throughout your home and that they are in good working condition.

* Have an emergency/fire evacuation plan in place, and practice it with your family.

If you have any questions on these safety precautions, the use and placement of fire extinguishers and smoke detectors,

preparing an evacuation plan, or the proper disposal of combustible materials, or if you'd like more fire and life safety information, please contact: the Redwood City Fire Department, Fire Prevention Bureau at 650-780-7400.



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


DISASTER PREPAREDNESS DAY

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REDWOOD CITY NOW ACCEPTING PASSPORT APPLICATIONS

The City Clerk's Office of Redwood City is pleased to announce that it is now accepting passport applications on behalf of the United States Department of State. The City has been designated as an official Acceptance Agency for passport applications.

To best serve the community, the City Clerk's office will accept passport applications Monday through Friday, between the hours of noon and 4:00 pm. No appointment is necessary. U.S. citizens needing a passport for international travel may call 650-780-7588 or visit www.redwoodcity.org (click on "I want to..." and select "Submit Passport Application") for more information. The Clerk's office does not provide passport photos these must be obtained from an appropriate passport photo

vendor (call the Clerk's office or visit the website for a partial list of locations).

"Redwood City is proud to be designated by the United States Department of State as a passport Acceptance Agency" said Patricia Howe, City Clerk. "We're ready to provide our community with this new service here at City Hall."

For complete passport application information, prospective applicants are encouraged to visit www.travel.state.gov, which is the only official website for passport information. At this site are downloadable passport application forms, current requirements and applicable fees, travel warnings, consular information sheets, and a wealth of other international travel more.

REDWOOD CITY BREAKS GROUND ON AFFORDABLE HOUSING

City officials literally kicked off the start of construction on the new Villa Montgomery affordable housing development at a special celebration on Thursday October 20th. The celebration took place on the site of the new project, at the corner of El Camino Real and Vera Avenue.

The Villa Montgomery housing development Kickoff and Groundbreaking Celebration was sponsored by Redwood City's Housing and Human Concerns Committee, which played a key role in bringing this much-needed affordable housing to the community.

Villa Montgomery is an exciting new rental housing development to be built by First Community Housing. It consists of 58 affordable rental units with rents ranging from \$350 per month for studios to \$1,400 per month for three-bedroom apartments. Recreational spaces for children and a separate area for adults, along with community space and other amenities, are provided. The property was acquired by the City and the Redevelopment Agency using Redevelopment, CDBG, and HOME Investment Partnership funds. The second phase will create eight self-help ownership units developed by Peninsula Habitat for Humanity. The contact for this project is Debbi Jones Thomas, Housing Coordinator at 650-780-7920.


