
\* the new RWS Library (over 220K raised and still going...please get involved and/or send \$\$\$)

#### **"VEHICLE ARSON"**

Redwood City Joins with United States Fire Administration, to dedicate a week to promoting a national recognition, awareness, and understanding of the arson problem in the U.S., one of our nation's most dangerous and costly threats to people and property. This year's theme is "Vehicle Arson: Who Pays for this Crime?"

The Redwood City Fire Department is taking this opportunity to remind the community that the incidence of vehicle arson is a very real and very serious issue. According to 2004 data, 36,000 intentionally set vehicle fires occurred nationwide that year, an increase of 18 percent from the previous year. Vehicle arson accounted for \$165 million in property damage, an increase of 25 percent from the previous year, and accounted for 29 percent of all arson fires. In fact arson is the second-highest cause of all vehicle fires.

The reasons for vehicle arson are many: it's not only auto thieves trying to destroy evidence, but also people trying to get out of costly auto payments, insurance fraud, and other illegal arson activities. The loser in all this is the driving public, who ultimately pays for it in their rising insurance premiums, which increase for everyone when crimes like this are committed.

The community is urged to visit www.usfa.dhs.gov for information on vehicle arson and other fire safety issues, including tips like these:

#### TO HELP PREVENT VEHICLE ARSON:

- \* Park your car in a well-lit area
- \* Use a secure parking lot for extended periods
- \* Close all windows
- \* Remove the key from the ignition
- \* Always lock doors, trunk, and tailgates
- \* Use antitheft devices
- \* Report abandoned cars to the police
- If you are in a burning vehicle:
- \* Get yourself and others out of the vehicle
- \* Call the fire department at 911 and tell them the location of the fire.
- \* Stay away from the vehicle do not try to retrieve personal property.
- \* Never put yourself in danger attempting to extinguish the fire yourself
- \* Do not open the hood or trunk if you expect a fire under it.

The Redwood City Fire Department reminds the community that by working together with the City, everyone can help prevent arson of all types, and protect the safety of our community, property, and lives.

#### PARK RULE CHANGES

As summer approaches, it's a good time to encourage everyone to make use of the 23 unique parks in our Redwood City system and let you know about some changes in the rules for these community spaces. Our parks range from small neighborhood parks of a quarteracre up to larger multi-use parks that are almost 40 acres in size. Our parks system also includes an Off Leash Dog Park, a Skate Facility and two outdoor pools that are open during the summer months. Â A quarterly recreation activity guide is mailed to all Redwood City residential postal customers in January, March, June and September of each year, and it includes a list of all the parks and their amenities. The Parks Department web page gives you even more information, located at www.redwoodcity.org/parks. You can also sign up to receive Parks newsletters and other documents by email, just go to www.redwoodcity.org/egov.

#### PARKS RULE CHANGES

• Hours of the parks are from sunrise to sunset (10:30 p.m. for lighted sports areas).

• Dogs are allowed in the parks on leash (6 ft. max.), but not on sports fields or in children's playgrounds.

• Smoking is prohibited within 25 feet of playground equipment.

• Littering, defacing, or destroying park property hurts everyone and can result in a fine of \$100 dollars or more.

• Inflatable Jumpers will be allowed at designated sites only (permit required after 5/24/07).

• Permits are required for any group of 25 or more people and for bringing in large equipment such as larger canopies, barbeques, tables, and chairs (effective

#### REDWOOD CITY MAYOR SIGNS U.S. MAYORS CLIMATE PROTECTION AGREEMENT

Last month the City Council of Redwood City unanimously authorized Mayor Barbara Pierce to sign the U.S. Mayors Climate Protection Agreement (www.seattle.gov/mayor/climate). This action adds Redwood City to nearly 500 other cities nationwide, representing more than 50 million Americans, whose mayors have signed this historic Agreement, and commits Redwood City to taking deliberate action to combat global warming. Redwood City has already been taking a number of specific actions over the last few years to reduce the energy consumption and greenhouse gas "footprint" of the City's own operation, including retrofitting traffic lights, converting incandescent light fixtures, replacing machinery with more energy-efficient equipment, introducing substantial water conservation programs and a recycled water project, supporting widespread tree-plantings, replacing fleet vehicles with hybrid models, incorporating a "green" philosophy in its Planning function, and more.

With this Agreement, Redwood City will next investigate various levels of activity aimed not only at further reducing its own carbon emissions, but also at helping the community atlarge to do their part at the household and neighborhood level. The Sierra Club Cool Cities Campaign (www.coolcities.us) is assisting the City in these efforts.

"Our goal is simply to bring to the City and our community viable options for every-day energy solutions that will help to curb global warming, protect our environment, save taxpayer dollars, and create a healthier community," said Mayor Barbara Pierce. "It has to happen at the local level, and Redwood City is proud to be part of the solution."

City staff will be presenting options for various levels of climate protection activity to the City Council as part of its budget deliberations in the coming months. These activity levels may range from, at a minimum, the City continuing to do all it can to reduce the carbon footprint of its own operations, to a more widespread community information effort.
